Eighty Years
1946 — 2026



SPECIMEN


Series 461 Military Payment Certificates were introduced on 16 September 1946, and the first MPC collectors were created. The thirteenth and last series was withdrawn 19 November 1973. Two additional series were printed, but never issued. Throughout the eighty years since the first issue, collectors have continued to study, search for, and collect military payment certificates. Many discoveries have been made by eager collectors. These include finding all but one replacement of the thirteen regularly issued series. Collectors also learned that individual series were printed as many as four times and that the respective printings are identifiable—and collectable.

Since 2000, collectors have held an event (called MPCFest) celebrating the greater MPC speciality field.

There is more to learn and more discoveries to be made.

Fest Bourse Events and Activities

The MPCFest bourse is the most unique such event in the country in many ways. Of course it is the only bourse in the world specialized in military numismatics—especially paper money. It features full and part-time dealers as well as collectors selling a wide variety of numismatic material, but emphasizing military money. In all cases the table holders are certain to have interesting items for sale, and, of course, they want to buy as well. It is also believed to be the only bourse in the country that is held exclusively on Friday.

Unlike MPCFest, the bourse is open to the public: everyone interested in numismatics is invited.

Specialty collecting groups also meet during bourse hours. The public is invited to these meetings as well.

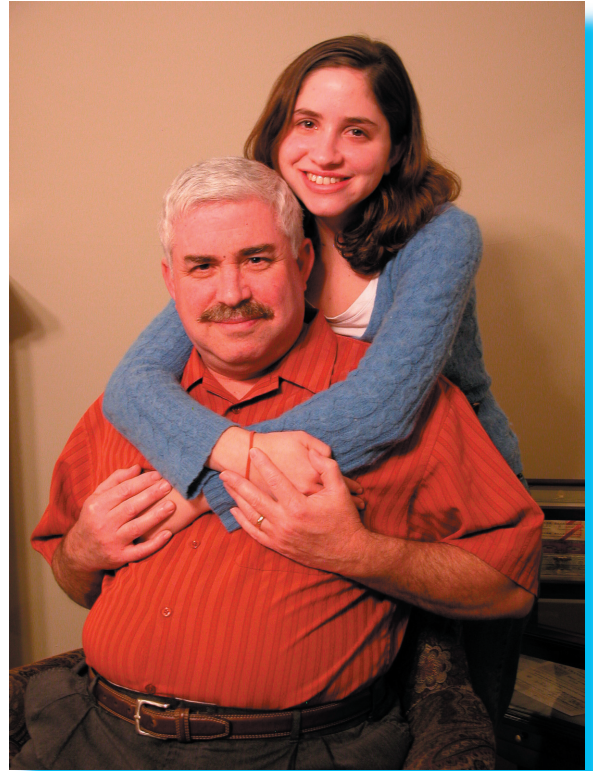
Since the beginning, we have had hundreds of presentations on all aspects of military numismatics. They range from simple and minor to major discoveries. Each year it seems that the briefings could not get better, yet the next year they are!

We have been very fortunate to have a wide array of important visitors at the Fest from concentration camp survivor Hans Walter to MPC designer and artist Len Buckley, World War II veteran and Tuskegee airman Harold Brown to this year's distinguished guest, Professor Kaz Fjita.

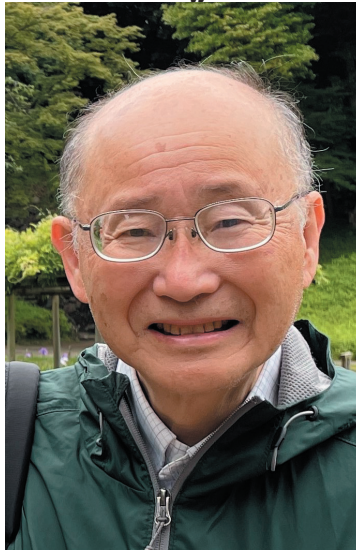
In addition to these more or less traditional learning activities, the Fest is full of learning. The military numismatics national championship tournament, formerly known as "March Madness," rewards knowledge in all areas of military numismatics. The winner of the tournament each year is crowned the national champion collector and is presented the Neil Shafer award. The award medal is named for Neil Shafer the legendary collector, mentor, and friend to Festers and countless other collectors world wide. By the way, he was a three time national champion winner of the tournament.

Pay activities and conversions are reenactments of nearly forgotten activities. Combine these diverse learning opportunities with the staff briefings and many Sunday field trips and you must conclude that MPCFest is a great learning event.

Since 2013 the outstanding trainer of the Fest has been determined and recognized by the battalion. Therefore it is important that you pay attention during the briefings. Furthermore, material from briefings are used for tournament questions.

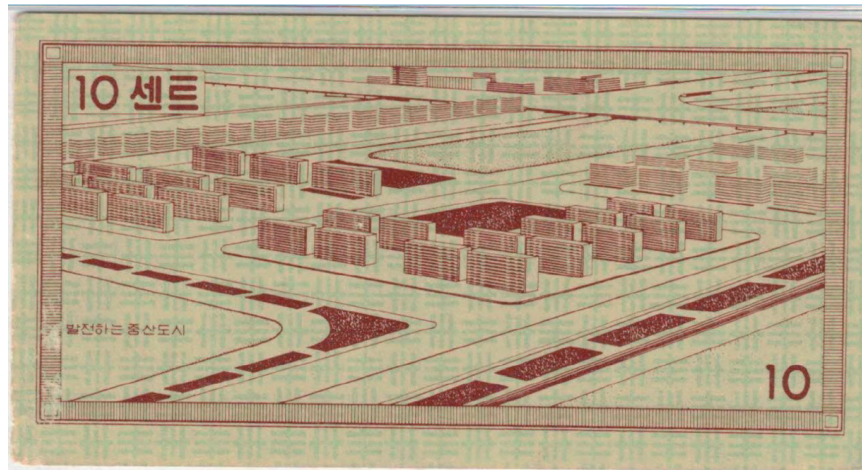
**MPCFest XXVII Keynote Presentation by
Kaz Fujita**

I started collecting Japanese Invasion Money (JIM) back when I was in high school and was encouraged to collect by block and look for variations by the late Adrian Nader over the following years.

In the late 1970s I had the good fortune to meet and talk with the late Isao Gunji of the research department of the Bank of Japan. Subsequently, I published a series of articles on the quantity printed and issued of Japanese military notes in *World Coin News* trying to use Japanese sources. After making acquaintance with Joe Boling many years later, I updated my earlier findings and, with his encouragement, published a revised article in the *IBNS Journal* in 2003. Through the years, I expanded my research interests to the financial and currency history of Japan, still with emphasis on the 1932 – 1946 period.

I continue to be interested in issue dates, quantities printed and issued, and minor variations in notes during the time of their issue. Over the years, I have collaborated with Joe on studies of hansatsu, notes of the reversion of Okinawa, local and private issues in the early 20th century, updates to *WWIIR*, and replacement notes, the subject of today's MPC Fest talk and intended for publication in the *IBNS Journal*.

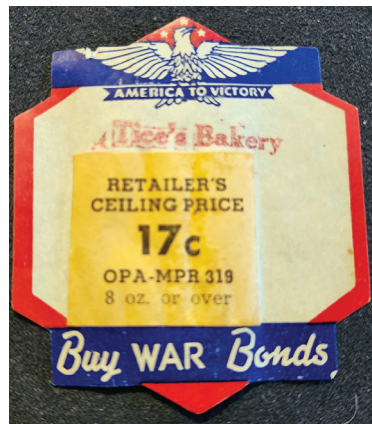
